New Hanover County Commissioner Appointed To Association Board

Bobby Greer, a member of the New Hanover County Board of Commissioners, has been appointed to a two-year term for 2008-10 to the North Carolina Association of County Commissioners' Board of Directors by NCACC President Bill Kopp of New Hanover County.

Greer will serve as co-chair of the Association's Legislative Goals Committee. He served as president of the NCACC in 1998-99 and has been active with the Association since being elected a New Hanover County Commissioner.

The Legislative Goals Committee will lead the 100 counties through an extensive process to develop proposed legislative priorities for 2009-10, including a statewide conference to vote on the final legislative agenda. After the legislative agenda is adopted, the committee will monitor the progress of the adopted priorities and help develop successful strategies.

The Association's Board is comprised of five officers, 18 district directors, county commissioners who are members of the Board of Directors of the National Association of Counties and several presidential appointees who either chair Association steering committees or serve as at-large members. The Board of Directors meets several times throughout the year to develop statewide policy goals in such areas as taxation, agriculture, environment, criminal justice, human resources and public education.
